DIY Summer Fun



DIY Sidewalk Chalk Paint

Let the driveway be your canvas with this homemade sidewalk paint!

What you need:

cornstarch
water
paintbrushes
food coloring or tempera paint

What to do:

- 1 Mix 1/4 cup of cornstarch and 1/4 cup of water for each color. Stir.
- 2 Add 6-8 drops of food coloring to each 1/2 cup of cornstarch mixture. Stir.
- 3 Use paintbrushes to spread the chalk paint and create your masterpiece.

Note: cleanup outside is easy – just spray the colored chalk off your driveway with a hose and water. Food coloring will usually come out of clothes with soap & water, but to be safe, you might want your kids dressed in their “play” clothes, not their fanciest outfits.

Sanity Savers

“Sanity savers” are quick-to-set-up, absorbing activities kids can do themselves – while you snatch a few minutes of quiet



Fairy Dust

A foolproof – and amazing – way to delight your kids and bring some focus to a chaotic afternoon.

What to do:

- 1 Surreptitiously scatter a good handful of sequins in your driveway/patio/sidewalk.
- 2 Distribute little Dixie cups/ziplock bags/snack bowls to your kids and announce that the fairies flew by and left behind some treasure for them to collect.
- 3 Sit down and have a cup of tea.



Paint Chip Scavenger Hunt

This is a great activity for indoor or outdoor fun. It can even be a great diversion on a long car ride—it’s pretty amazing to find all the different colors on a road trip!

What to do:

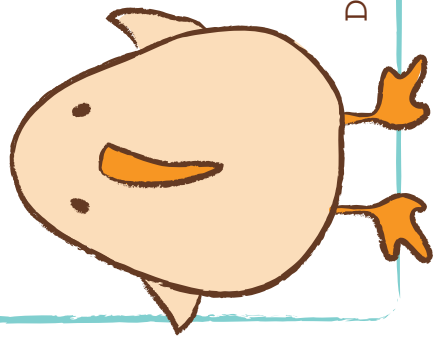
- 1 Pick up some extra paint chips from your local hardware or paint store.
- 2 If you like, cut them into individual colored squares. If you have a hole punch, punch holes in the corners and gather them together with twine or a rubber band.
- 3 Send your kids out to find things around the house or outside to match the paint chip colors. Make a game out of it: set a timer to see how many different colors you can find, make a chart of how many items of each color you can find, even play paint chip bingo!



“Draw Your Day” Printable Placemats

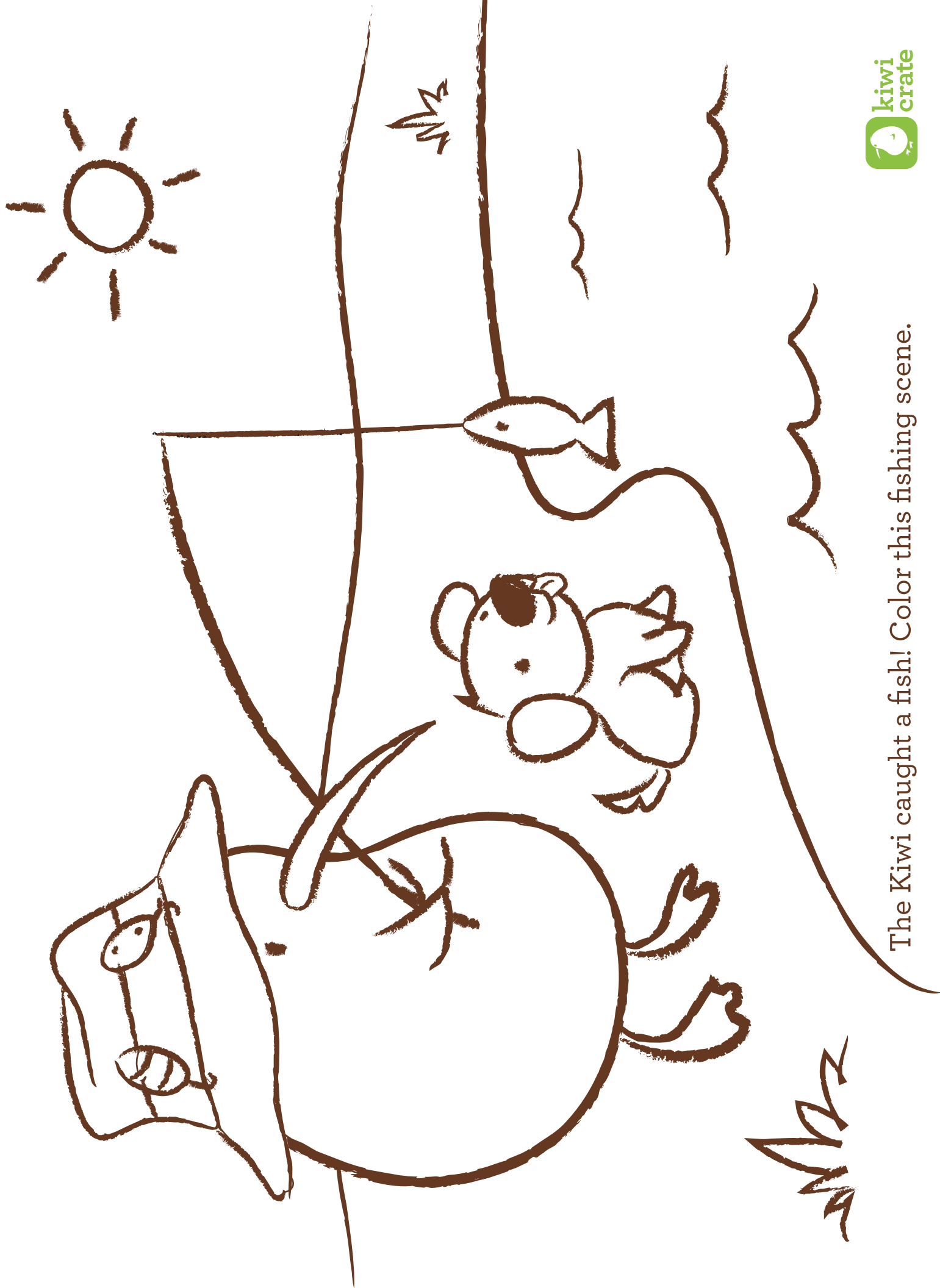

Car Window Sticker Scene

Long car ride ahead? Prepare a sticker scene for the backseat window - and prevent a collage of stickers from materializing all over the back seat.



What you need:

contact paper permanent markers masking tape stickers

What to do:

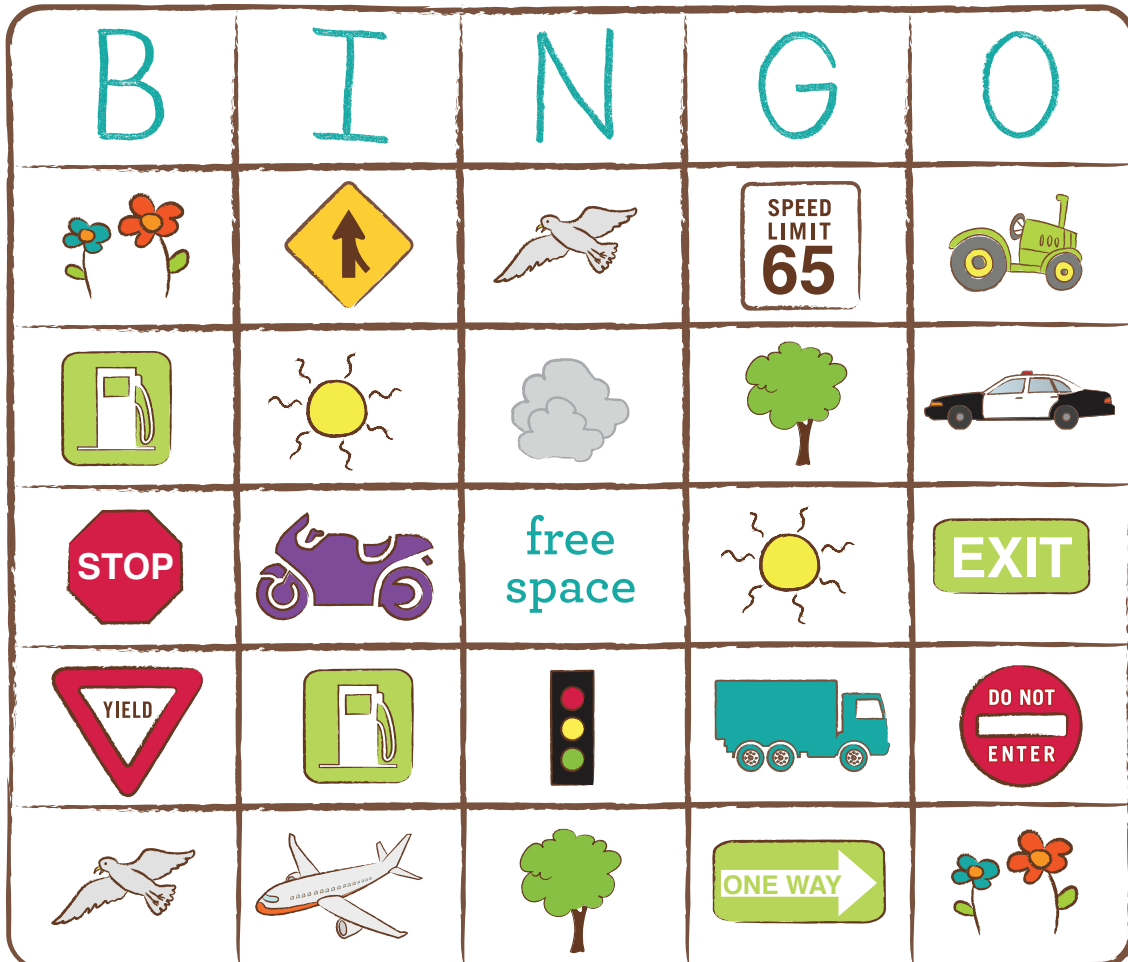
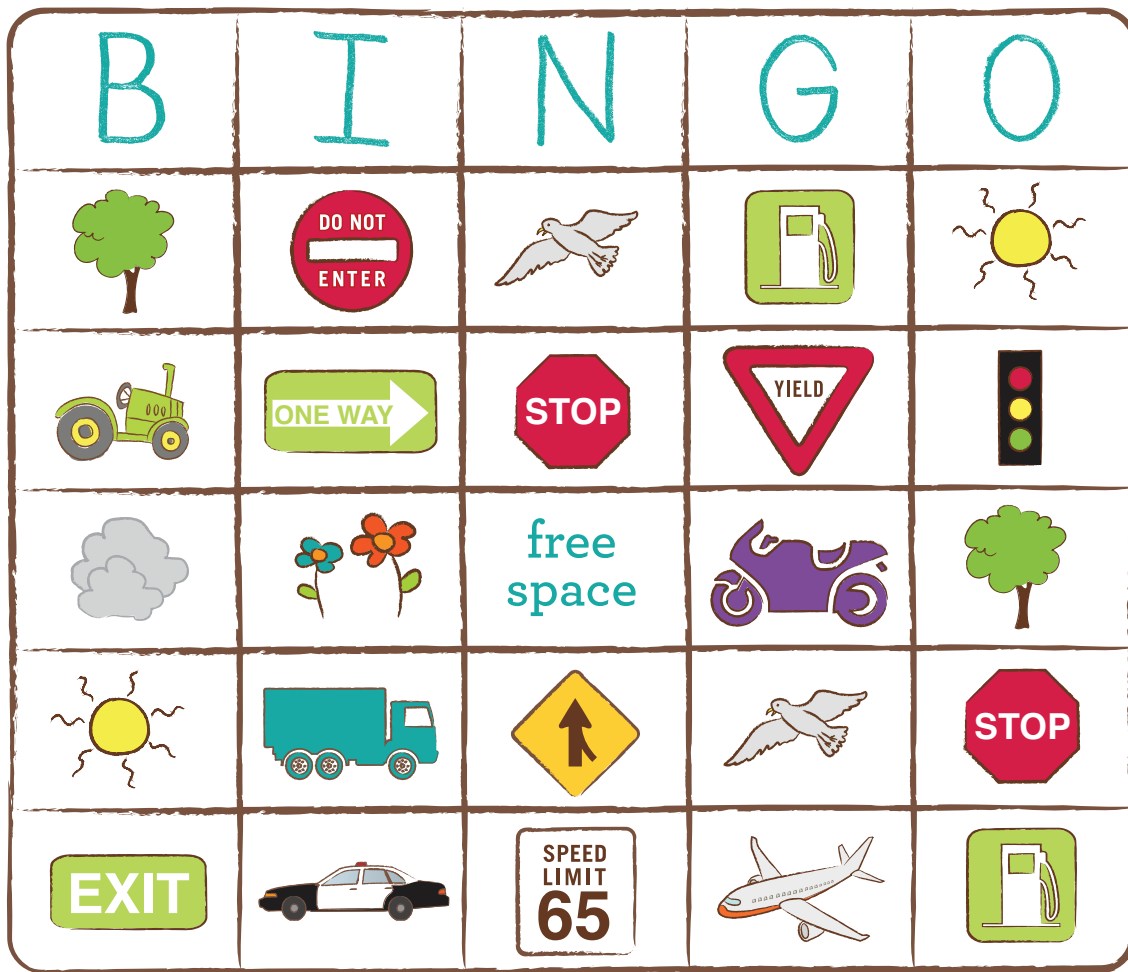
- 1 Cut the contact paper to fit your backseat window.
- 2 Tape the paper to a tabletop with the masking tape, then draw a scene on the contact paper with the permanent markers. Your kids can, of course, help with this step – unless you want to keep it a surprise!
- 3 Once the ink has dried, peel off the backing and place the paper right on the window.
- 4 Let your little one go to town placing stickers on the scene! Once the trip is over, you can peel the contact paper right off. If you like, you can stick it to a piece of white paper to save as a special little souvenir of your trip.
